Groups, committees and forums

We continued to run our influential practice forums, special interest groups and advisory committees. We also launched a Foster Carer advisory committee bringing together a diverse group of foster carers from across the country. The expertise and lived experience they bring both informs and challenges our work.

Our journal

Our journal, <u>Adoption & Fostering</u>, continues to attract submissions from countries across the world and our readership is increasing year on year. A standout article in 2021 was "They want to give our children to white people and Christian people": Somali perspectives on the shortage of Somali substitute carers", by Camelia Chowdhury.

National adoption strategy

In the summer, the Department for Education published its <u>National Adoption Strategy</u>, setting out its plan to deliver a high-quality, child-centred service and appointed a national strategic lead, working closely with the Regional Adoption Agency leaders.

We will continue to support this change agenda and our members through our training, good practice guidance and our assessment forms.

Advice and Information

Our <u>Advice Line</u> is a very popular membership benefit and we answered nearly 2,500 enquiries. Enquiries ranged from post-Brexit impacts on eligibility to adopt and foster, to record retention and access within RAAs, to leaving care entitlements.

What sets our service apart is the expert advice available from our in-house legal and health consultants, as well as our specialists in fostering, adoption and kinship care. Our Information Service supports the Advice Line with up-to-date research, resources, and statistics.

Care Review

We engaged with the Independent Review of Children's Social Care on your behalf, with Dr John Simmonds contributing to the Evidence Group and Josh MacAlister speaking at our Members' Day in September. Read more about our ideas for change here.

Members' Day

More than 260 representatives from member agencies across the UK joined us for our annual event in September.

We have recently published an anti-racist statement on our website as well as a diversity statement in relation to our journal *Adoption* & *Fostering*. Our Wellbeing for Professionals sessions explore the intersection between personal and professional wellbeing, addressing the physical impacts of stress, the impact of the pandemic, and the art of reframing. Consultancy

We continued to provide specialised, reflective supervision as well as consultancy advice on areas as diverse as agency decision making processes and developing a new Life Story policy for cared for children and young people.

Publications

Members received copies of books for social workers, adopters and foster carers, with easy to read, practical advice. New guides explored allegations in foster care, the new Moving to Adoption model, food issues in looked after children and difficulties in learning caused by early trauma.

We revised several of our bestselling guides giving members access to the most up-to-date information and guidance. These included <u>Beyond Together or Apart</u> and <u>Undertaking a Fostering Assessment</u> and our popular guide for those thinking about adoption, <u>Adopting a Child</u>.

We launched a new series of pamphlets for foster carers, with reliable, concise advice on potential complex issues when caring for fostered children, including radicalisation, self-harm and online safety.

Electronic forms

We have published new forms on sibling assessment, risk assessment in foster care, assessing a carer's new partner, and early permanence placements. We also revised our health assessment form and improved its digital functionality. This is something we are working to roll out across all our forms.

Blogs

This year we launched a blog section on our website, offering shorter pieces on the work of CoramBAAF and our members. Recent articles include supporting adopted children at school, and anti-racist practice in the family justice system. We are always keen to hear from members so please get in touch with any blogs or ideas.

Training

Over 3000 of you attended our training events in 2021 — more than ever before. The most popular topics included: Making Fostering Assessments, Child Permanence Reports and Life Story training.

We also delivered our well received Learning from Case Reviews webinar to nearly 400 participants from a range of organisations. The <u>book</u> on the same topic – by Hedy Cleaver and Wendy Rose – looked at case reviews in adoption, fostering and kinship care, and identified areas of best practice and areas for development.
